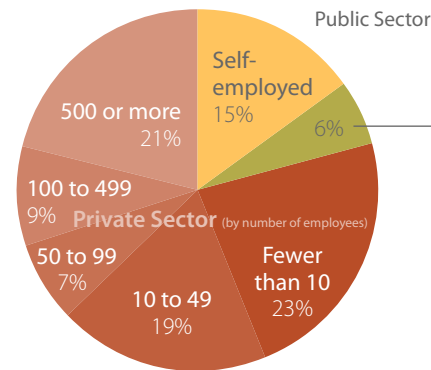

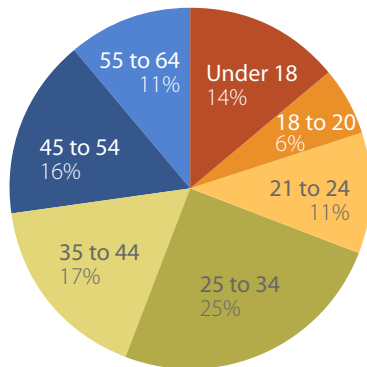

#### EMPLOYER SIZE AND TYPE\*

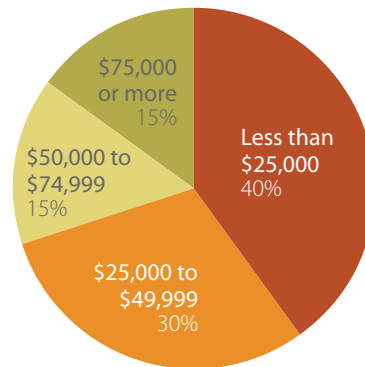

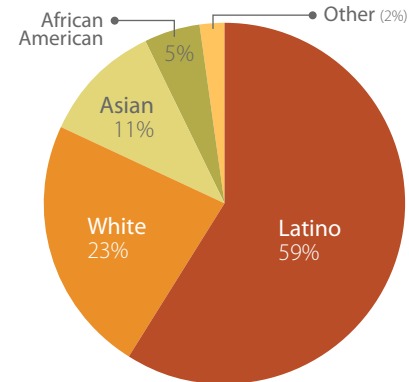
#### AGE GROUP



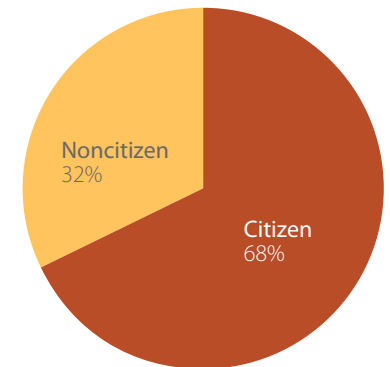
#### FAMILY INCOME



#### RACE/ETHNICITY



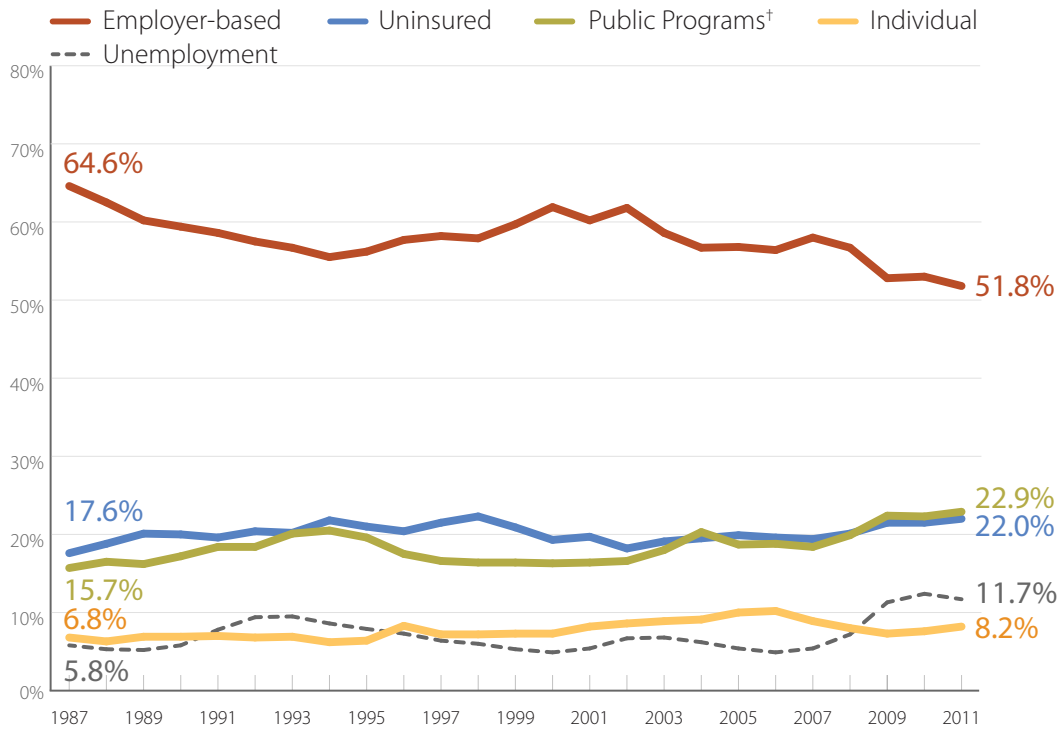

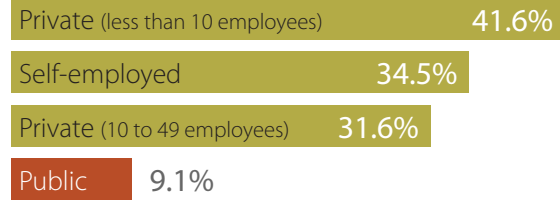

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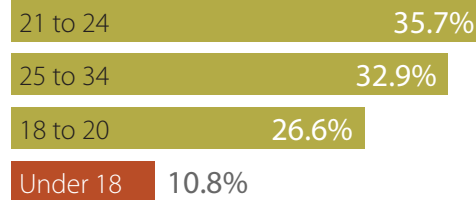

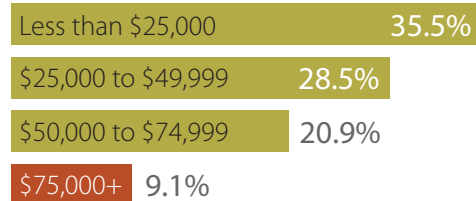
### By Employer Size and Type



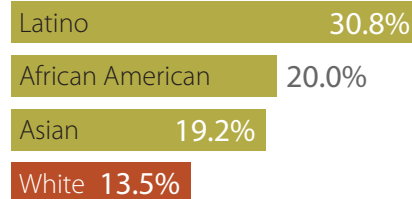
### By Age
