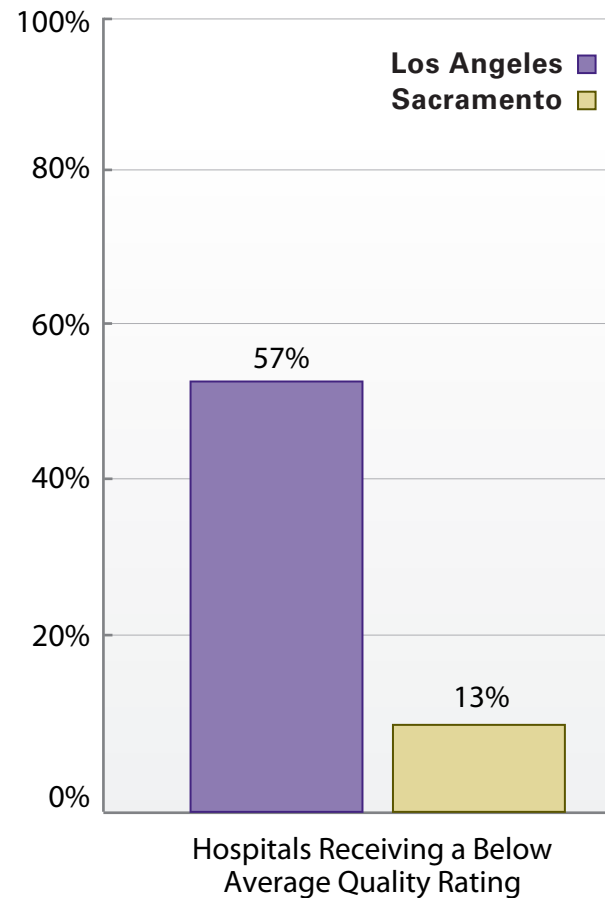
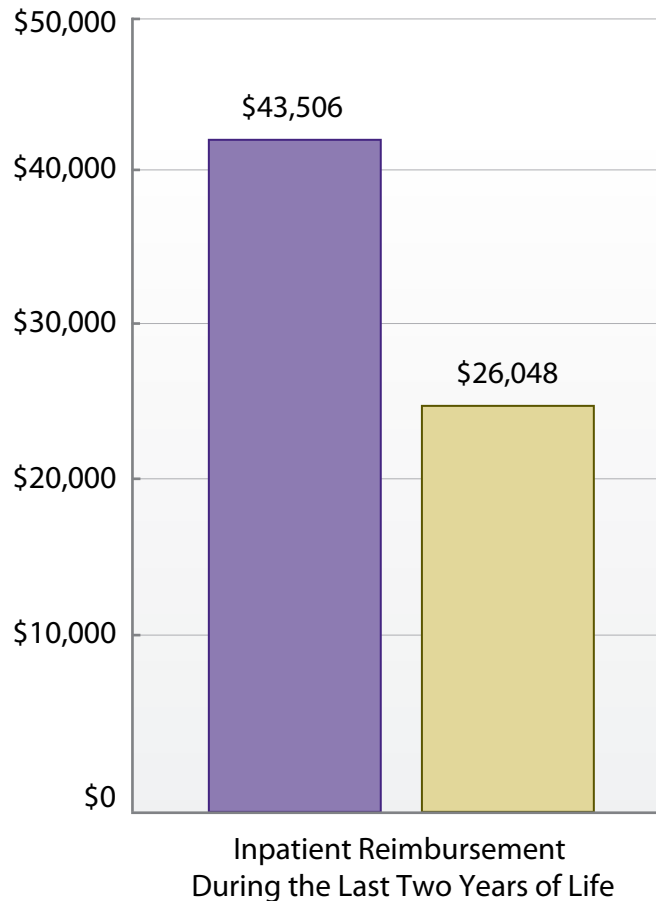

Los Angeles and Sacramento

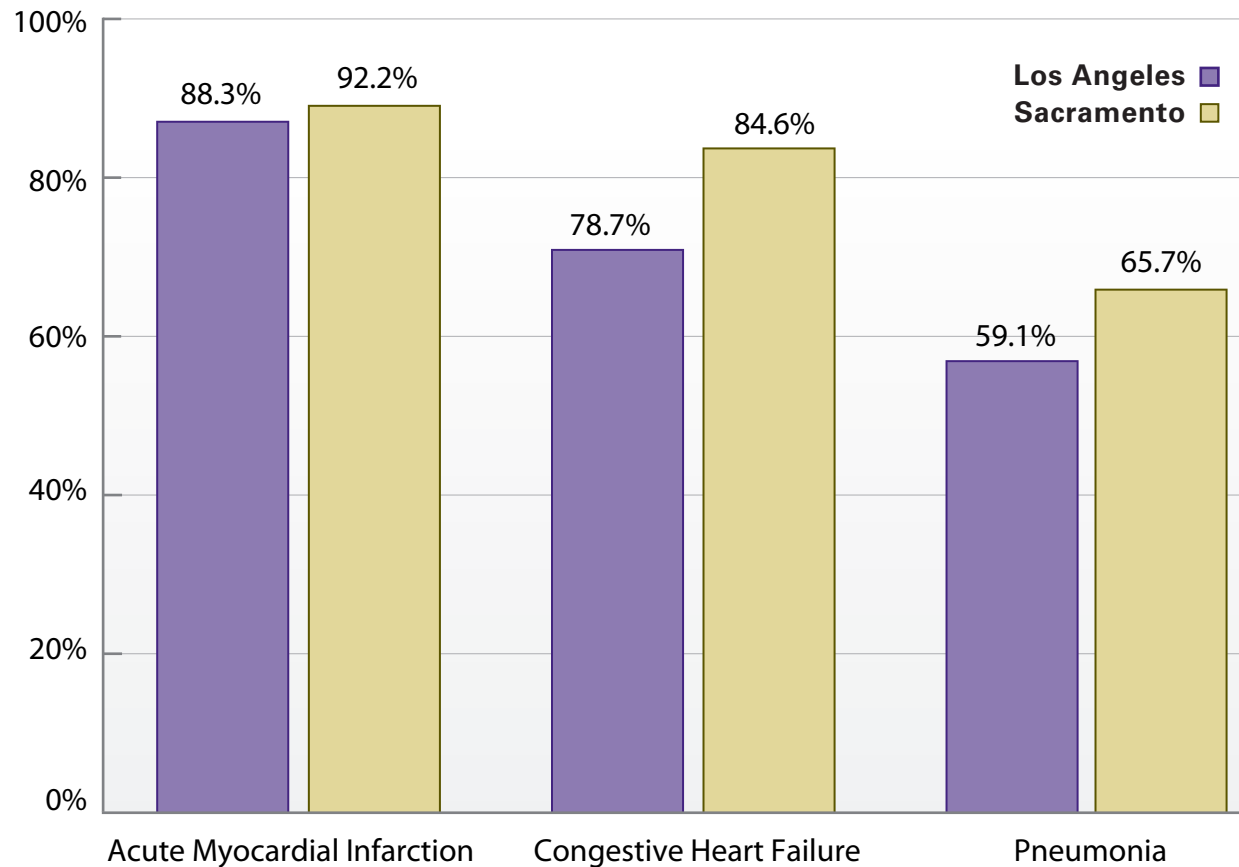


While Medicare spends more in Los Angeles hospitals, patients express higher dissatisfaction with the quality of the care they receive.

Los Angeles and Sacramento

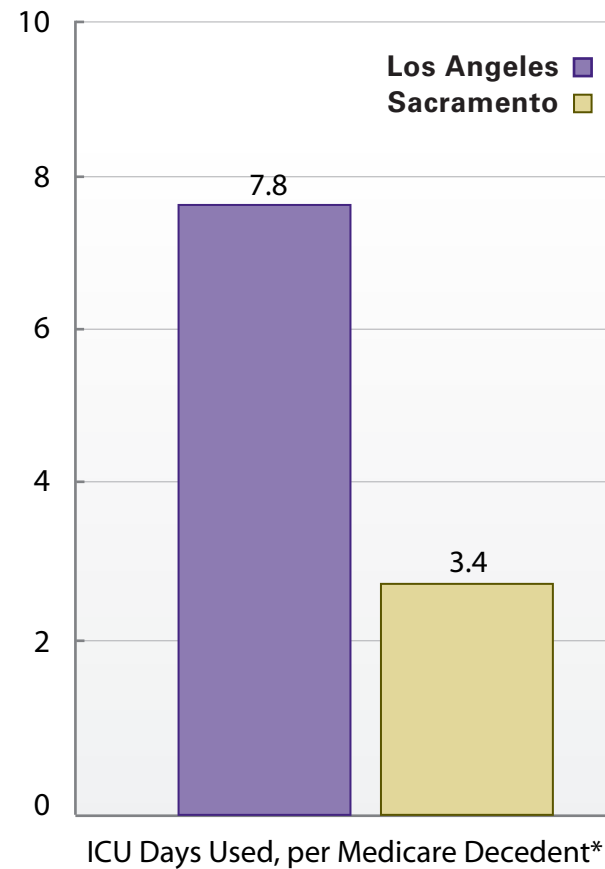
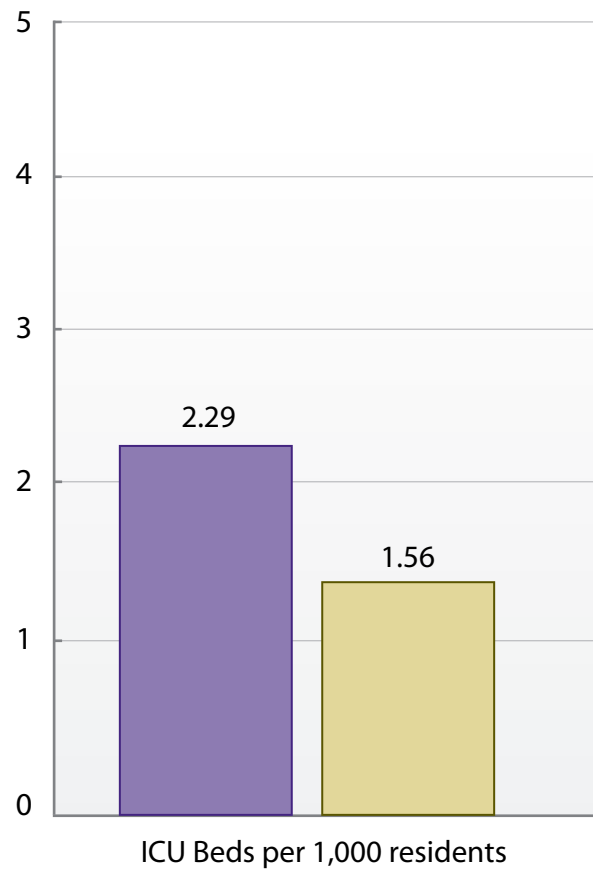


Sacramento hospitals perform better on quality measures for chronic conditions, even though they spend less on care.

Los Angeles and Sacramento

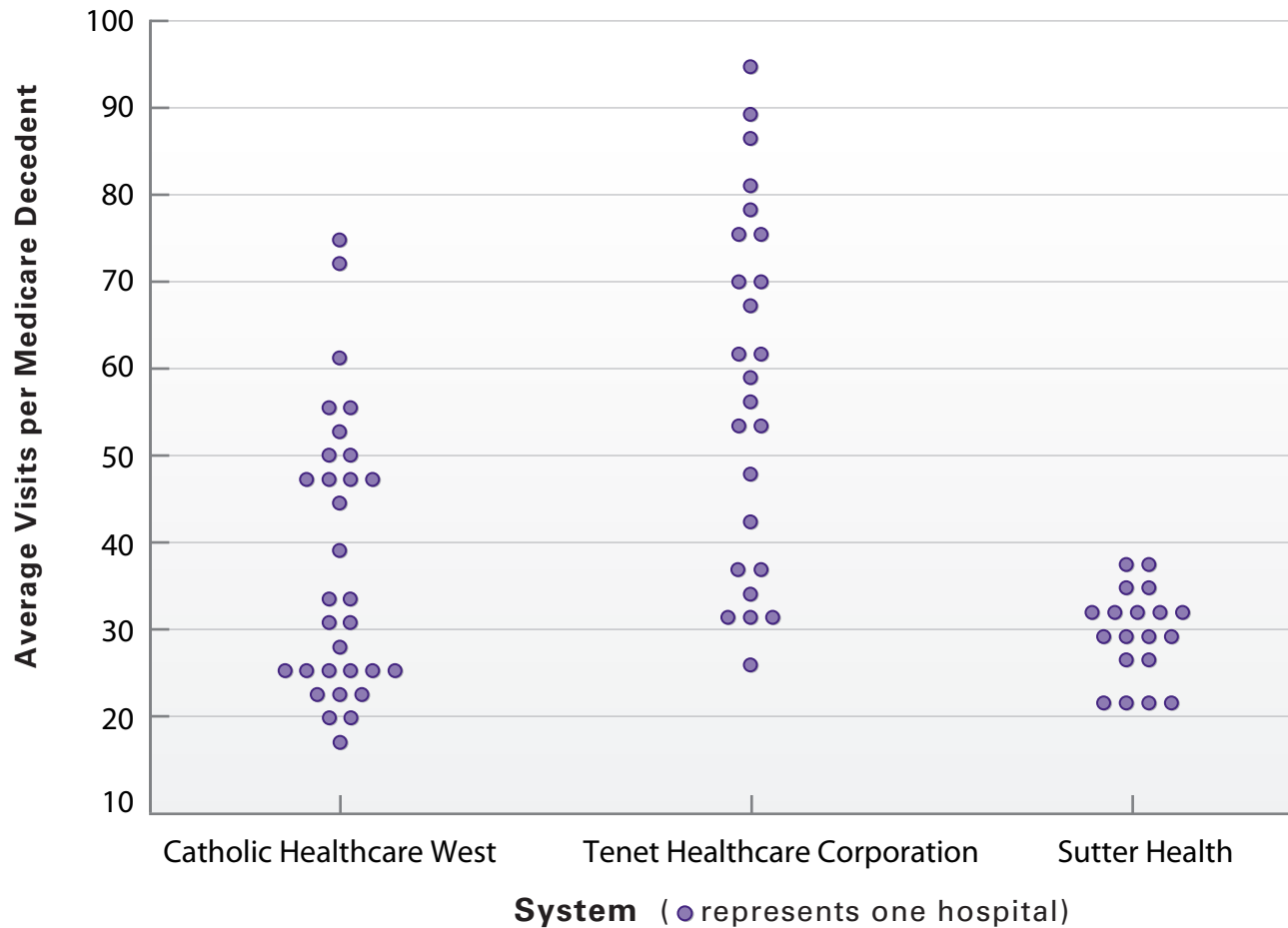


In Los Angeles, with significantly more ICU beds than Sacramento, the likelihood of being admitted to an ICU is far greater.

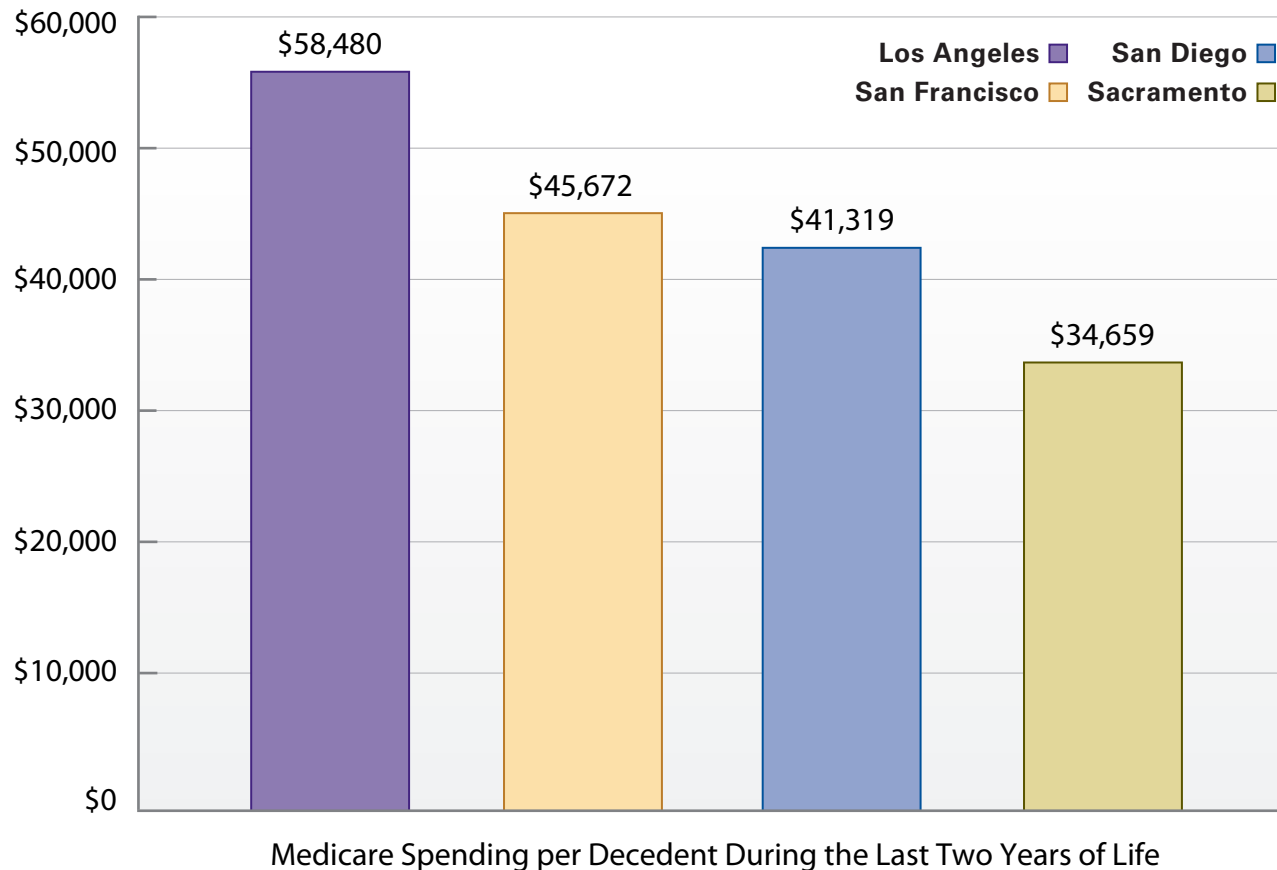
Physician Visits During the Last Six Months of Life by Selected Hospital System
