California's public hospitals and health systems: A vital part of the safety net

- 21 public health care systems across state
- Serving 2.85 million
 patients annually
 regardless of ability to pay
 or insurance status

While public hospitals make up only 6% of state's hospitals:

They provide 40% of all hospital care to the remaining uninsured in California.






And provide nearly 35% of all hospital care to Medi-Cal enrollees in the communities they serve.

Public hospitals and health systems:




35% of patients speak a primary language other than English

Half of all California's top-level trauma and burn centers





Train half of all new doctors in hospitals across the state



- Ramping up telehealth




Emerging challenges
