- Outreach, care planning, closed loop referral, transitions between settings



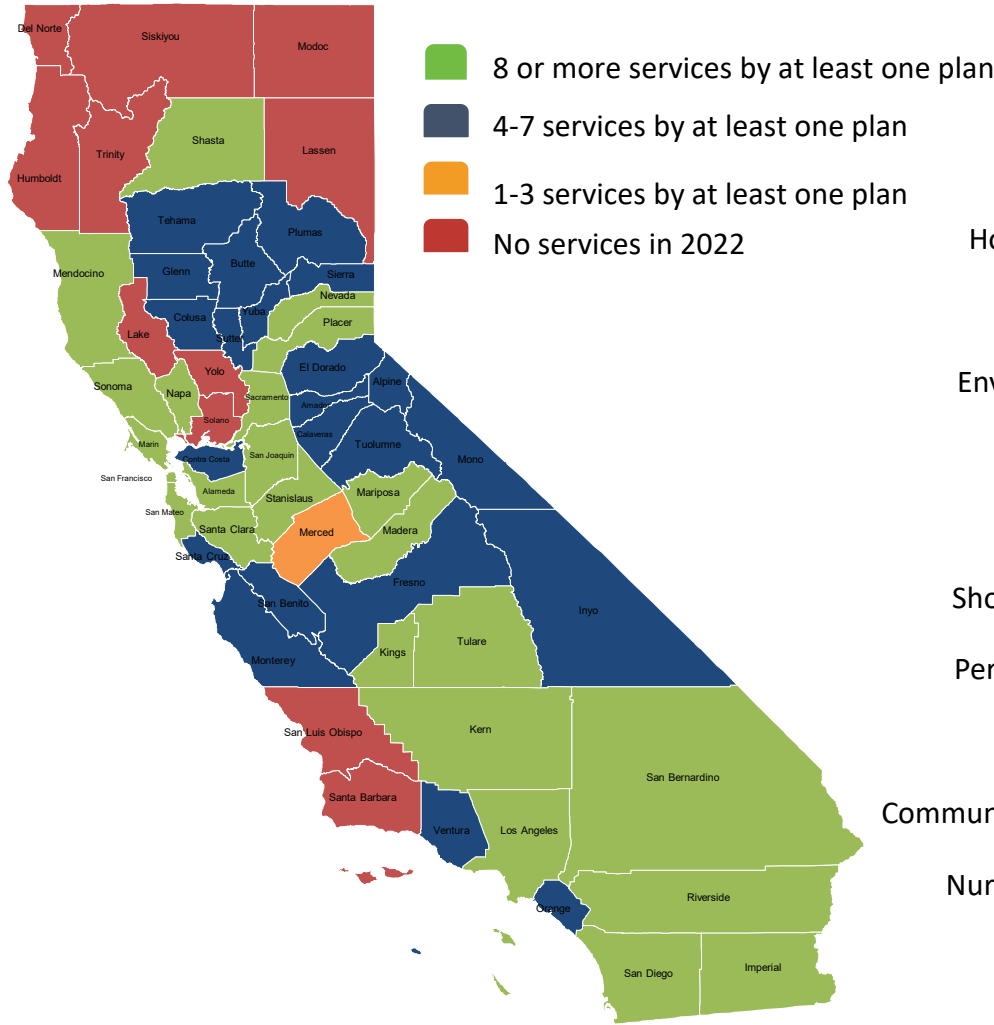

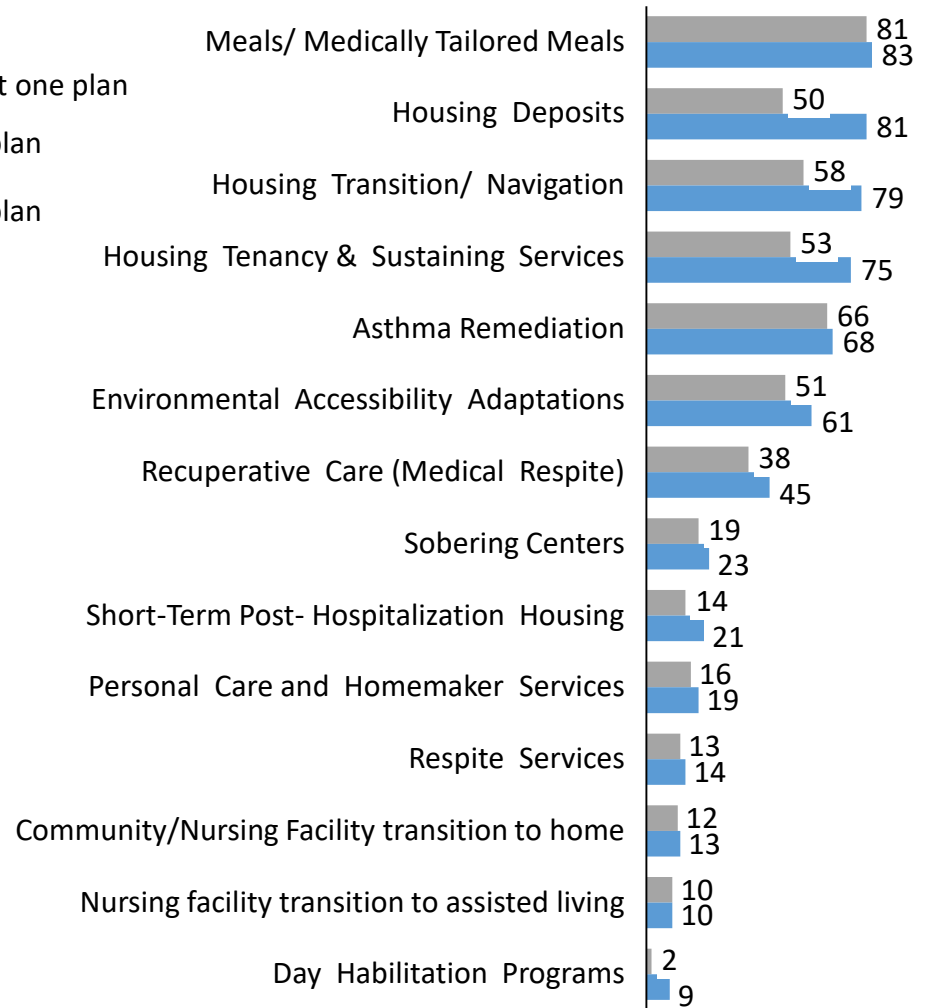
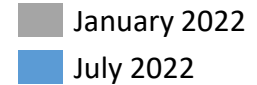
2022 Community Supports offerings

Providing Access and Transforming Health (PATH)

- **One-time infrastructure investments**
- **Addresses needs like data exchange and workforce development**
- **Important tool for equity**

Changes in 2023

- **Population Health Management**
- **Carve-in of Long Term Care**
- **Pre-release coverage and re-entry supports**
- **Enhanced Care Management**
 - Individuals Transitioning from Incarceration (adults and children/youth);
 - Members Eligible for LTC and at Risk of Institutionalization; and Nursing Home Residents Transitioning to the Community.
 - Other Children/youth populations of focus
- **Additional community Supports**
