







PEH by Gender, CALIFORNIA, 2020




PEH by Age, CALIFORNIA, 2020

PEH by Ethnicity, CALIFORNIA, 2020







Hospitalizations, BY GENDER, 2019




ED Visits, BY GENDER, 2019






Hospitalizations, BY RACE/ETHNICITY, 2019


Hospitalizations, BY AGE, 2019
